And they remembered his words. (Luke 24:8 ESV)

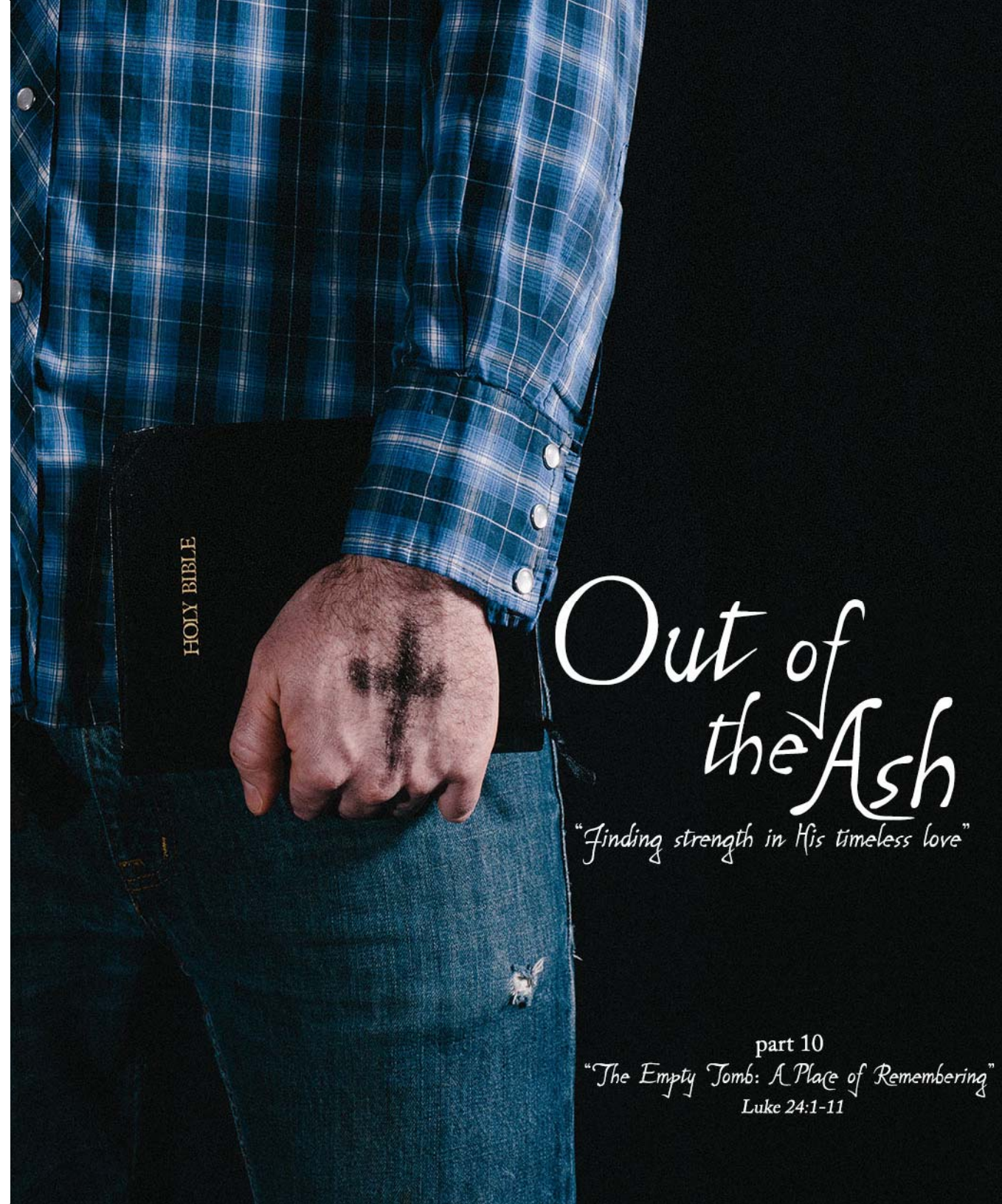
